MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



As mentioned previously, with the introduction of legislative amendments our council must adjust the way in which we calculate rates from using site value to capital value with changes scheduled to be implemented in the 2023-24 financial year. With these amendments the State Government has removed

our ability to continue using site value and we know that this will prove difficult for some ratepayers, while others will see a benefit. We are committed to managing the change and offering assistance to anyone experiencing difficulties at this time. We will be holding information sessions and opportunities to work with council to see how these changes will affect you individually and we ask that you contact council directly as soon as possible to seek arrangements, if required, to suit your circumstances. We are obligated to comply with the new regulations but assure you this process does not result in any additional rates income for council outside any increase in line with inflation as consulted through our annual business plan and budget.

It is fantastic to have a full complement of elected members once again. Congratulations to newly elected Councillor Fran Francis and welcome back to Councillor James (Jim) Haskett. A special mention to Dianne McDonald for nominating. Although unsuccessful, I acknowledge she is a strong and committed community member and we sincerely thank her for running.

We have partnered with Our Town in hosting 2 University students to survey and engage our youth to explore ways we can improve our offerings to this age group. We're excited by the work Sara and Lucy have completed and look forward to hearing more and implementing strategies that can help young adults in Kimba share their voice.

I am honoured to be re-appointed the Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association ['EPLGA'] President for a further 2-year term. I welcome Mayor Jo-Anne Quigley (Lower Eyre) as Deputy President. On the 16th of March delegates, including Deputy Mayor Lienert and CEO Deb Larwood, toured Port Lincoln and viewed the proposed and disputed desalination water plant site at Billy Lights Point and Mussel and Kingfish farming operations nearby, before our official EPLGA board meeting.

The 86th EPLGA conference followed and was a huge success. We had presentations from ARWA, SA Space Industry, Fortescue Future Industries, RDA EP, Hydrogen jobs plan and many more. In my welcome address I emphasised the enormous growth and economic potential that exists in our region and how we need to welcome opportunities and tackle challenges head on.

From the Local Government Association of SA, we are delighted with the announcement of a proposed Accord announced at the State/Local Government Fconomic Development Partnership at the Forum Adelaide Convention Centre on 24th of March. It was great to speak at the forum alongside the Premier, Deputy Premier and Minister Geoff Brock with 54 Mayors and a further 120 plus elected members in attendance. On the back of the establishment of the Regional Housing Unit, within Renewal SA earlier in the month, it's been a strong and positive time for local government, and in particular, rural and regional councils and their communities. I believe developing our relationships and strengthening our networks is paying dividends an ultimately these benefits flow to our communities, which I welcome.

GRANTS PROGRAM 2023-2024

In 2023 Council is running both the Community Grants Program and Small Business Grants Program to enable the equitable and fair allocation of funds to address priority

community and business's needs. Grants are available for up to \$5,000.

Application forms and amended guidelines are available on the Council Website or hard copies from the Council Office at Cross Street Kimba.

Small Business Grants

District Council of Kimba's Small Business Grants program is now open. Local businesses can apply for grants of up to \$5000 on a 1:2 basis which means that for every dollar a successful applicant puts into their program, Council will match it with \$2.

Eligible projects may include improving shopfronts, building websites, upgrading equipment, and accessing training and development opportunities.

Last year the Small Business Grants program supported eight local businesses, funding projects such as improving shopfronts, building websites, upgrading equipment and accessing training and development opportunities.

The Little Coffee Pot was one of those businesses, receiving \$2833 to purchase a brand new coffee machine.

The funding round is now open. Applications close at 5:00pm on Friday 12 May.

YOUR RATES WILL BE CHANGING

Due to recent changes to the Local Government Act 1999, an initiative of the South Australian Government, Council will be required to change the basis of rating from Site Value to Capital Value and is looking to implement this change in the 2023-24 financial year. Both values are provided to council by the Office of the Valuer General.

To allow ratepayers to get familiar with the current Capital Value of their property before it is used for rating purposes, it has been included on your rates notices for the past 3 quarters for information purposes only.

If you think that the value is incorrect, you can lodge an objection with the Officer of the Valuer General, using the process outlined on the back of the rates notice. A successful objection against your Capital Value won't change your rates for 2022-23 year but will mean that the value will be more representative in the future, when council commences using this value for rating purposes.

Council will continue to keep ratepayers informed as more information about the change to the basis of rating becomes available. We will also ensure there is ample opportunity for residents to be consulted throughout the process by holding community consultation sessions. These sessions will be beneficial for all ratepayers to gain a better understanding about how these changes will impact your rates.

Council anticipates these community sessions will be scheduled for the near future so be sure to be following Council's Facebook page for further updates.

FLOOD DAMAGE REPAIRS

Council staff and contractors are busy working on repairing our road network following the January 2022 storm event. This work will take many months to complete. We are currently working in the Waddikee area which is nearing completion. DM Roads were successful in winning the sealed road repairs which were also severely impacted. work on these repairs will commence in May and will also take a number

KIMBA LANDFILL AND RECYCLING CENTRE

Following discussions with Council's insurers we have been advised to cease the practise of individuals removing material from the site.

Currently Council is at risk if an injury were to occur to an individual that was removing materials from the site. An example of this may be removing steel from the scrap stockpile and an injury such as a cut was to happen. Signage has now been put in place advising of this. Users can request the site supervisor to salvage an item for them subject to his approval. These new conditions are effective from Thursday 30th March 2023. BURNING WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP

As part of the new rules under the Environmental Protection Act of which the Environmental Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 is attached to, limits burning activities undertaken within townships in SA.

The Environmental Protection (Air Quality) Policy 2016 has banned:

- A fire in the open within a township may only be lit for cooking or burning charcoal only in a specific container for domestic heating.
- The burning of agriculture or forestry waste and vegetation in the open within a township may only occur within the issuing of a burning permit. Permits are restricted and must be adhered to.

Council previously determined that the township of Kimba falls within the following boundaries:

 Haskett Road, Buckleboo Road, Cant Road, Freeth Road, Hopcraft Road, Kimba-Cleve Road, Eyre Highway and Railway Terrace.

It is also a reminder that fire danger season does not finish until April 15th, 2023. Fires lit in the fire danger season must have a permit, otherwise hefty fines may occur.

Council has been made aware of instances where this has occurred but after the event. If you have any concerns about fires burning within the township, please contact council or those burning during the fire danger season please contact SAPOL.

Eyre Peninsula Local Government Association (EPLGA) Conference

I had the pleasure of attending the 86th EPLGA Conference in Port Lincoln, which ARWA proudly sponsored. I gave a presentation about how ARWA can work together with Eyre Peninsula communities and councils on mutual challenges and opportunities to drive economic growth and a sustainable future in the region.

Hí Everyone,

Brenton & I wanted to say a huge thankyou and give an update on Brenton's progress to the people of Kimba.

Brenton's journey started on the 17th Oct. with a very sore back, by the 21st he was on the floor paralysed from the waist down. He was flown to Adelaide where he had emergency surgery to release his spinal cord and told, hopefully he will walk again. He spent 2 weeks at the Royal Adelaide, 6 months at Hampstead & The Repat. This was when we decided he needed to stay in Adelaide to continue his rehab for the best outcome possible. I continue to go back and forwards, able to continue working thanks to the support of my work mates at Kimba.

Brenton has gone from being completely paralysed, learning to use a wheelchair and not being able to do much at all to living a fairly normal life only in a wheelchair. He is very determined to walk again, going to gym up to 3x a week. The gym specialises in people with disabilities. Going to Uni SA once a week walking on a treadmill in a harness and once a week to the therapy pool. He had to learn to stand again, has gone from walking in a gutter frame to parallel bars to walking frame. This is very exhausting but also exciting as any improvement is getting closer to his goal of walking again.

Brenton continues to remains positive after 18 months of treatment and rehab. This is largely due to the amazing support from Family, Friends and the town of Kimba. We have been overwhelmed with the generosity from everyone, from Prayers, thoughts, donations, phone calls, visits, people looking after & keeping an eye on our home.

So we would just like to say once again thank you so much for your care and support.

It is very much appreciated.

Agsave Clients Look West on a Scale of Economy Study Tour

In February, three Agsave staff and 27 clients from the Kimba and Cowell districts embarked on a study tour to learn from Western Australian farmers how they manage scale in an expanding enterprise.

The study tour was initiated by the staff of Agsave, and clients were invited to participate based on their support of Agsave over the last few years. The group was a good mix of younger and experienced farmers, and farm employees. Everyone was keen to learn new technologies and systems from outside of our district and state.


Over four days the group visited five Esperance farming enterprises; Chilwell Farms, Warrakirri Farms, Younghill Farms,

MR & HL Wandel, Phil and Tom Longmire, NRI Ag reseller "Farm and General", Adama and Planfarm representatives and did a tour of the Little Creatures Brewery.

The following morning three Eyre Hub board members and one Kimba Councillor took the opportunity to meet the CEO of Peel Business Park in Nambeelup to tour the facility for comparison to the Eyre Hub project.

The aim of the tour was to aid our local growers in expanding their scale by meeting with interstate farmers who have successfully achieved massive growth in their own farming business.

The major take home message from everywhere we visited was to achieve scale the biggest challenge is people. You need to employ the right people for the right jobs and to manage them in the right way to get the best results.



We also thank our clients for their support over the years and for the manner in which everyone conducted themselves on the trip.
