



A history of Kimba and its agriculture

In 1839, three years after the declaration of the colony of South Australia, explorer, Edward John Eyre was the first recorded white man to pass through the Kimba district, but prior to this Aboriginal tribes from the Gawler Ranges trekked through the region to the coast in winter periods.

The Hundred of Kelly was surveyed in 1898, with the pioneer farmers and families settling in 1905. The railway line reached Kimba in 1913 and the township was declared in 1915. A vigilance committee managed district affairs until the formation of the District Council of Kimba in 1924. During the 1920s Kimba gained most of the essential buildings including a hospital, institute, school, police station, post office, hotel, banks, shops and garages. With these additions, the town and district prospered, and 23 one-teacher schools were erected during this early settlement.

Until the 1970s permanent water was always Kimba's biggest challenge, when water was piped from Polda. A separate pipeline which carries water from the River Murray was completed in 2007.

The first crop of wheat was sown in 1908 using horse-drawn machinery. Technology has continued to develop, from axe to crawler tractor used to clear the land, then horse teams to tractors in the 1940s and '50s to pull machinery,



and stump rakes replacing hand picking of stumps. Harvesting by stripper and winnower has been replaced with combine harvesters.

Today crops are sown with sophisticated tractors and equipment, using computers and GPS systems to not only steer the equipment, but also allowing the farmer to vary inputs, such as seed, fertiliser and other crop protection products. Harvesters now monitor and record yield variances, with this information going back to the farm office for evaluation to be used in planning seeding inputs to maximise crop yields on varying soil types, in a low and variable rainfall. Throughout the district's history, yields of crops and pastures have increased with the adoption of innovative practices and improvements in plant breeding.

Livestock, particularly sheep, play a major part in the district's economy and today local farmers continue to produce food for world markets.

ATTRACTIONS

Silo Art

The artwork by artist Cam Scale on the Viterra grain silos was created in 2017 and took 26 days and 200 litres of paint to complete – impressive hey! It was commissioned by the Kimba Community Development Group through Juddy Roller as part of the Igniting Kimba Arts Program.

Don't miss seeing the mural come alive at night when it's illuminated by solar powered lighting. Parking and a viewing platform can be found on Railway Terrace. For safety and security reasons, visitors are asked not to pass the barrier guides on to Viterra property.

Gawler Ranges Information Bay

This uniquely designed structure displays directions and features of the Gawler Ranges National Park. It's situated on Railway Terrace, an easy stroll to the centre of town, or there's easy parking for caravans and motorhomes.

Arie's Garden

A sustainable and mature dry lands permaculture garden of food-producing trees, vines, vegetables and flowers plus organic aquaculture. Entry by gold coin donation, proceeds to Royal Flying Doctor Service.

The Big Galah

Want another "Big Thing" to tick off the bucket list? Our eight metre tall Big Galah stands in front of the Halfway Across Australia Souvenir Shop, on the Eyre Highway. Originally built in 1993 by the Venning family, the Galah underwent a major quirky makeover in late 2021. You can't go through Kimba without snapping a selfie with our pretty bird.

Housed in a revamped tractor shop on Kimba's main street, Workshop26 is Kimba's creative quarter – a melting pot of makers and microbusinesses with a welcoming ambience. Get a taste of our wonderful community while seeing makers at work, whether it's the in-house soap maker or the resident potter firing clay and fashioning unique pieces. You'll also find locally-made homewares and gifts, vintage and repurposed treasures, and a range of other creations, plus glimpses of what the 90-yearold building used to be. Add barista coffee and homemade goodies to start the day, and this is a must visit for everyone. High Street Mosaic

Dancing dunnarts, pirouetting mallee fowl and a guitar strumming bicycle lizard all feature in Kimba's Iconic Native Species mosaic in the Memorial Gardens. The magnificent mosaic was completed by artist Karen Carr, 2019's Kimba Art Prize and Exhibition Artist in Residence, and community members.





Corey Enright Oval and Kimba Districts Sporting Complex

The sporting complex boasts football, netball, cricket, tennis and basketball sporting bodies. The complex is open in winter on Thursday nights and for Saturday home matches, and on most Saturdays during the summer. Playing courts and ovals neighbour the complex, along with a shaded playground and drinking fountain.

Sharing our History Mural

Originally commissioned in 2001 by the Kimba Show Society, *Sharing Our History* is located at the Recreation Reserve. In 2017 the original artists, Siv Grava and John Turpie, returned to refresh the mural to its former glory, supported by local artist Steve Rigg. This mural is just another spectacular piece of artwork that Kimba has to offer.

Kimba & Gawler Ranges Historical Society

The Kimba Museum showcases early agricultural life of the Kimba district. Located in mallee parkland opposite the grain silos, an old railway turnstile provides access to the Pioneer House dating back to 1908. Showcasing early lifestyle, you can visit the One Teacher School, Pioneer Store, History Room, Government sheds, dog fence, water conservation, tractor collection and blacksmith shop. "Clancy" the first fire truck and the telephone exchange are other interesting historical displays.

The sheds and outer buildings house collections of early agricultural machinery, horse drawn wagons, stationary engines and blacksmithing tools.

Minerals on Eyre

Barry and Jodie Schubert have been collecting minerals for more than 40 years and have more than 2400 interesting and rare specimens on display in Eyre Peninsula's largest mineral and fossil display. Located approximately 45 kilometres from Kimba at Carrapee Hill, this tourist attraction is just a stone's throw away.

Roora Stormwater Catchment Viewing Platform

View the large-scale water security undertaking from one of the best outlooks in Kimba. The Roora Stormwater Catchment Project is run by the District Council of Kimba and covers an incredible 40,000 square metres, providing the town with the equivalent of five Olympic pools' worth of additional rainwater every year – not bad for a project situated in a place with an average annual rainfall of just 339.2 millimetres.

Edward John Eyre Sculptures

Erected in November 2011 and sculpted by Roland Weight and Marcus Possingham, these stunning figures are a tribute to Edward John Eyre and the Indigenous men whose bush skills he so often relied on. Born in England in 1815, Edward John Eyre, is remembered as the first man to cross this continent and to record exploration of the three sides of the peninsula named in his honour. Lake Eyre and the Eyre Highway are also named in recognition of his skill, perseverance and courage.





Roora Nature Trails

Get outdoors and enjoy a leisurely stroll through nature along our picturesque nature trails. Situated on the outskirts of Kimba, the trails are approximately a six kilometre return walk. The Roora Nature Trails feature two smaller loop trails and a main walking trail. The main trail features several sculptures made from recycled steel – keep your eye out for various native animals including an echidna, emu, wombat and more.

The trails include informative signs providing information on key features along the way, including the "Chapple" which housed dam construction workers. The main walking trail consists of two kilometres of easy walking through the old Roora Water Reserve, with the third kilometre gradually rising as you reach the Whites Knob Lookout, home of the artistic Edward John Eyre sculptures.

Whites Knob is an ironstone conglomerate outcrop formation on the north-western outskirts of Kimba, providing a delightful vantage point to view the surrounding countryside. Grab a drink or have a picnic under the shaded picnic shelter. A directional dial will also help identify prominent landmarks up to 50 kilometres away. An 86-metre tall telecommunication tower is also situated in the area.



All-abilities Playground and Jumping Pillow

Our Lions Apex Central Park boasts some of the most sensational recreation equipment in regional South Australia. This colourful and exciting space includes an all-abilities playground that each and every pint-sized visitor can use, as well as a jumping pillow – always a favourite, hey, even mum and dad can give it a go. With plenty of shaded areas, toilets, tables, a drinking fountain and barbecue facilities available, the whole family will have a ball!

GAWLER RANGES NATIONAL PARK

Gawler Ranges National Park, is an untouched natural wonder featuring ancient rolling hills interspersed with wideopen plains and fascinating geological features. The park is renowned for the magnificent organ pipes; some of the largest volcanic formations in the world.

100 kilometres east of Kimba, the Gawler Ranges is the perfect destination to experience the South Australian Outback.

Featuring stunning rocky outcrops throughout the park with seasonal water flows enhancing the impressive Yandinga Falls and Kolay Mirica Falls.

Enjoy the remote tranquillity at one of the seven campgrounds, nestled at the foot of a granite hill, rocky gorges or grassy valleys and plains.

From your campsite the open countryside provides opportunities for relaxed walking through one of the many marked walking trails in the park. Spot over 21 rare and threatened species, from Major Mitchell's Cockatoo to the elusive Yellow-Footed Rock wallaby. The striking beauty, abundant wildlife and vibrant seasonal wildflowers attract many visitors and the park provides access tracks for both 2WD and 4WD vehicles.

Old Paney Homestead, built in 1888, provides a glimpse into the rich pastoral heritage of the Gawler Ranges. Nearby Policeman's Point is the site of the first police camp in the region and a short walk will take you to a beautiful gorge that flows seasonally in a series of waterfalls and rock holes.



National Park entry and camping bookings

All National Park entry and camping permits must be obtained online before entering. The staff at the Council Office can assist with your bookings (business hours only) alternatively it is easy to do yourself.

- Travelling into the Gawler Ranges you should be aware you are passing through pastoral lease land.
- Camping is only permitted within the Gawler Ranges National Park or at Mount Ive.

PARKS AND RESERVES

Mt Ive Station

The 900 square kilometre property provides some of the best opportunities to enjoy the vast volcanic landscape of the ancient Gawler Ranges. Attractions include ridge top scenic tracks, 4WD and 2WD tracks, guided tours by arrangement, Lake Gairdner, organ pipe rock formations, bush walking, bird watching, historical sites and photography. Accommodation includes shearer's quarters, stone huts and camp grounds including powered and unpowered sites and bush camping.

Pinkawillinie Conservation Park

This mallee park offers plenty of four-wheel driving opportunities. Adjoining the Gawler Ranges National Park, Pinkawillinie is a vast area of bushland that boasts vibrant wildflowers during spring. A popular attraction in the area is Corrobinnie Hill which is located within Corrobinnie Hill Conservation Park. Consisting of unusually shaped, weathered, granite rocks and caves this site is accessible by 4WD only. No facilities are provided at either park.

Lake Gairdner National Park

Situated north of the Gawler Ranges, the park features over 200 islands and salt lakes, including Lake Everard, Lake Harris and Lake Gairdner – which happens to be the third largest salt lake in Australia! Here's another fun fact, some parts of the lake consists of salt layers up to one metre thick. Experience breathtaking views over vast white salt sheets contrasted with spectacular ancient red ranges. Bush camping is allowed at Waltumba Tank or on Mt Ive Station by arrangement. Vehicles are not permitted on the lake.

Lake Gilles Conservation Park

This park is a semi-arid mallee landscape comprising salt lakes, low sandy rises, gypsum dunes and isolated stony hills. The beautiful salt lake comprises scenic and tranquil surrounds, and is a photographer's and birdwatchers delight. Self-sufficient bush camping is permitted in the park although no facilities are provided. Tables are provided overlooking the lake, so pack a picnic and enjoy lunch with a view. Access to the lake via the Eyre Highway 17 kilometres east of Kimba is suitable for conventional vehicles.

Secret Rocks Nature Reserve

Also known as Refuge Rocks, this impressive granite hill was discovered by Edward John Eyre in 1841. Recent conservation works have been carried out at this reserve to protect native flora and fauna such as Malleefowl, bandicoots, pygmy possums and rare plants. There are self-guided walking trails and a designated picnicking area in front of the rocks. It is located 35 kilometres east of Kimba on Middleback Road.

Caralue Bluff Conservation Park

Caralue Bluff Reserve covers an area of around 2200 hectares and is located 27 kilometres west of Kimba. There is a large picnic ground located on the western side of the reserve. From this area you can go bushwalking and hill climbing to the top of the Bluff where you will overlook a large part of the Eyre Peninsula hinterland. There are no designated or signed walking trails so you will need to make your own path to the top. Visitors need to be aware that there are no facilities provided in this park and everything is completely BYO.

Bascombe Rocks Lookout

A 20-kilometre drive along the sealed Buckleboo Road through farming country will bring you to the Bascombe Rocks lookout. From atop the granite outcrops you have panoramic views of the surrounding native bushland. Around the base of the rocks investigate the innovative water catchments that were built by the early pioneers of the district and can still be seen today. After it rains the rock holes fill with water and here you will discover hundreds of lively tadpoles which is always a favourite with the local kids. After exploring the rocks, relax with a drink or lunch under the picnic shelter.

Carappee Hill Conservation Park

Carappee Hill, which means 'place of water' is the most extensive and highest exposed granite rock on the Eyre Peninsula. Approximately 53 kilometres south west of Kimba, Carappee covers an area of approximately 850 hectares. At 495 metres above sea level, take a climb to the top (approximately a two hour return walk to the bottom to the top) following the painted white arrows from the southern corner, or stroll on the eastern side. There are also picnic areas and bush toilets available in the park.

FREE CAMPING AREAS

Kimba is an RV-friendly town which provides amenities to meet all your needs. There are free camping options available including:

The Gums

Short-term camping (one night) is located on the Eyre Highway. Facilities include public toilets and plenty of shady trees.

Recreation Reserve

If you're exploring the Eyre Peninsula by caravan, RV or even staying in a tent, there is no better location to base yourself for a few days than at Kimba's free camping area. Conveniently located at the town's recreation reserve, this free camping area provides travellers with a cost-effective stay for up to five days (longer stays need to be negotiated with Council). The Recreation Reserve includes a range of impressive facilities including two large gravelled areas from which to choose from, two coin-operated showers (\$1 coins required), two separate amenity blocks and what many have told us is the most userfriendly dump point in the region. The most recent addition to the free camping area is our shiny new camp kitchen. The kitchen boasts four free barbecues, numerous sinks, ample bench space and plenty of seating. We even supply baking paper dispensers to make cleaning the barbecues easy, yes we have thought of everything.

With the Roora Nature Trails right on your doorstep and Kimba's sporting facilities and shaded playground only a few minutes' walk from your site, you'll be set to explore the sights and meet new friends as the sun sets on another day of fun filled adventures in Kimba. Oh and did we mention that Kimba is the proud winner of the Best Grey Nomad Council Free-stay Campsite in Australia for three years running? This amazing feat has earned our Council a place in the Grey Nomad Awards Hall of Fame. Why not stay a few nights and find out what all the hype is about for yourself? You certainly won't be disappointed!



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
